Job Summary/Objective:

Sweet Briar College invites applications for a one-year, part-time, non benefits-eligible appointment at the rank of Instructor in Latin for the 2017-2018 academic year. The successful candidate will be expected to teach a 2-1 course load. Teaching responsibilities in the fall semester will include introductory and intermediate Latin courses, with introductory Latin being the primary focus of the instructor in the spring term.

The Program in Classics is housed within the Division of Humanities at Sweet Briar College that celebrates connective, multi-disciplinary thinking. Composed of seven traditional disciplinary zones—Classics, French, English, Philosophy, Religion, Spanish, and Art History—the Division of Humanities is an inclusive intellectual environment that seeks to foster intellectual curiosity and creativity on all levels.

Required Qualifications:

We seek an engaging, pedagogically innovative scholar with demonstrated excellence in teaching to join our community. Candidates with a Masters degree or above will be considered, but preference will be given to those candidates who have completed a Ph.D. in Classics or a related field, or who those who are in the process of completion of such a degree.
