Administrative Experience

Open Society Foundations (OSF)

Higher Education Support Program of the OSF has created and supported over fifty liberal arts colleges in the former Soviet bloc. Hired to re-orient the Program, I have focused on the twin projects of supporting institutional and pedagogical innovation in liberal arts colleges in the Global South; and supporting higher education for refugee populations, particularly Syrians in Turkey, Lebanon, and Jordan. The program provides grants to higher education institutions; annual budget is \$27 million.

University of Virginia

The College and Graduate School of Arts and Sciences has 11,000 undergraduate students, 1,600 graduate students, 800 full time faculty. It also has its own board, the College Foundation Board, as well as a number of volunteer boards. The important challenges I faced in 2008 were to (1) raise global visibility of research programs of College and Graduate School; (2) modernize and provide new discipline for the administration and finances; and (3) augment financial resources by increasing philanthropy.

(1) Research Excellence and Global Visibility:

- Completed a comprehensive restructuring of the graduate programs, reallocating \$35 million to 25 PhD granting programs based on performance, and significantly improving the amount and number of fellowships, and providing for the first time multi-year guarantees.
- Established partnerships with Peking University, Hong Kong University of Science and Technology, as well as Humboldt University in Berlin, to collaborate on research and graduate training. A new collaborative program – Jefferson Global Seminars – is ongoing.
- Established Asia Institute, which was conferred the status of the National Resource Center, with an award of \$4 million.
- Established the Institute for Global Cultures, which was supported by the Mellon Foundation with an award of \$3 million.
- Partnered with Coursera to deliver classes online to the rest of the world. One course – World History from 1775 – had an enrollment of 75,000.

(2) Managerial Accomplishment:

- Created a multi-year, integrated financial plan that is scenario-based to support the strategic directions for the College and Graduate School, and transitioned from a budget-centric to a more analytic decision-making environment
- Revamped divisions of finance, budget, and human resources; and created office for educational technology and office for space design
- In spite of the \$15 million cut in base budget, imposed by the Commonwealth of Virginia, the management of the reduction was orderly and strategic, informed by a clearly articulated set of priorities, with a clear sense of direction for the future.
- Created *de novo*, a reserve totaling \$7 million, for the first time in history of the College.

(3) Fundraising:

- Redesigned and reformulated the fundraising operation of the College. Prior to my arrival, the College was raising less than \$10 million a year. As of last fiscal year, we were raising \$62.2 million a year. The total raised during my deanship was \$260 million.
- Completed, using a combination of alumni gifts and state funds, the financing of one major building complex that was in progress when I arrived; 4 new buildings (the Caplin Theatre, Physical and Life Sciences Building, the Music Building, and the Art Building) and the through renovation of the 150,000 sq. ft. office and classroom building.

As dean in charge of the social sciences at Michigan, I oversaw a division with over 300 faculty members, supporting their research and teaching activities, and collaborated across the University on global initiatives, global area studies centers, and served on a number of boards and committees.
