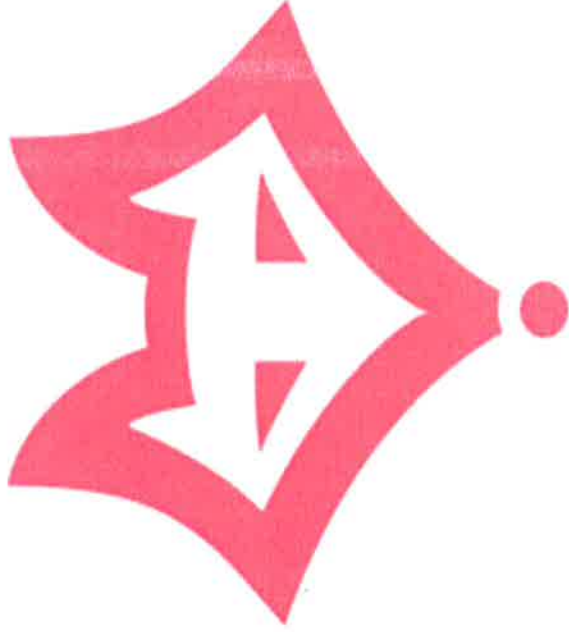

Very limited stalls available! Those with confirmed stall reservations must arrive before 6PM the night before the show (Friday, October 7th).

Anyone present must comply with the Sweet Briar College COVID-19 Protocols. When outdoors participants are not required to mask if they can be socially distanced. Indoors masks are required regardless of vaccination status.

Entrance to the facility will only be through the main campus gate house. Anyone with a large truck and trailer will need to make arrangements with management to plan arrival.

Directions to the riding center from main entrance: At the first traffic circle take the second exit that takes you behind the chapel. At the second traffic circle take the first exit that will take you through a parking lot. Follow the road down the hill and around the Red Barn – the entrance to the riding center will be at the top of the hill. Please follow all signs for parking.

- ◇ Show management reserves the right to combine, cancel, and split classes as it deems necessary for the betterment of the competition.
- ◇ Sweet Briar College, its staff, officials, or SWVHJA will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, groom, or animal at the show.
- ◇ All exhibitors must wear ASTM-approved head gear with the chin strap fastened at all times when mounted on the show grounds.
- ◇ There will be a food truck available and have concessions for purchase.
- ◇ All schooling is at your own risk.
- ◇ All dogs must be on leashed white on the show grounds.

Sweet Briar College Medal – Open to juniors and amateurs. To be shown over a course of no less than six jumps set at 2'9". Course must include two changes of direction, and may contain an in and out. The judge will then have the option of testing the top four riders. Tests 1-10 may be used. The same horse must be used in both phases. Three competitors must compete the course for points to count. Riders may not have shown in a 3'6" or higher equitation medal class, and may not jump higher than 2'9" at the same show. This class may be combined with other classes with similar specifications. This class is not recognized or sanctioned by SWVHJA. Finals will be held at the SWVHJA Annual Horse Show. To qualify for the 2021 finals, a rider must have competed in at least one SBC Medal class prior to the finals.

Oakridge Medal – Open to junior and adult amateurs. Over fences phase will consist of a USEF-type equitation and AO/JR jumper course of at least 10 fences at 3' – 3'3" with spreads up to 4'. Flat phase counts for 50% and must be run first. No martingales of any kind are permitted in the flat phase. Ten riders from the flat phase will be called back for the over fences phase; jump order to be chosen by the judge. Judge may require additional tests from USEF tests 1-19. Minimum of 3 to fill class.

Directions:

From Charlottesville: On Route 29S, take the Madison Heights/Sweet Briar College exit. Go two miles past the college entrance. Turn right just before the Bet Bet/Citgo service station onto Route 663/Smokey Hollow Road. Go about one mile, bearing right at the fork. At the bottom of a fairly steep hill you will see a sign for the Harriet Rogers Riding Center. Turn right.

From Lynchburg: On Route 29N, go about 10 miles past the James River to Faulconerville. After the Excel Station (on right), get in the left lane. Turn left at the Best Bet/Citgo station, driving across Route 29S onto Route 663/Smokey Hollow Road. Go about one mile, bearing right at the fork. At the bottom of a fairly steep hill you will see a sign for the Harriet Rogers Riding Center. Turn right.

From South of Lynchburg: On Route 29N just past the Lynchburg airport, exit onto 460 East towards Appomattox. Take exit 29N Bypass (Charlottesville/Amherst). Exit at Route 29 Business/Amherst/Sweet Briar College. At the end of the exit turn left to go towards Sweet Briar College/Madison Heights. Go two miles past the college entrance. Turn right just before the Bet Bet/Citgo service station onto Route 663/Smokey Hollow Road. Go about one mile, bearing right at the fork. At the bottom of a fairly steep hill you will see a sign for the Harriet Rogers Riding Center. Turn right.

Parking:

- ◇ Please watch for and follow parking signs
- ◇ Large trailers/horse vans may turn around in the parking area behind the indoor arena.
- ◇ Large trailers and horse vans may park on the East Side of the riding Center or in the parking lot behind the indoor arena.
- ◇ To keep the road clear, parking is restricted to the south side of the road, which is the right side of the road as you enter the facility.

Hunter Divisions

All Hunter Classes are judged on performance, manners, way of going, and soundness.
Unjudged Warm Up - An unjudged warm up round to be ridden prior to your judged class. Only one round may be ridden in each section.

Open Hunter - Open to all riders mounted on horses or ponies. Unrecognized division. Fences offered at 2'3", 2'6" & 3'.
SWVHJA GREEN HUNTER - Open to horses in their first or second year of showing over fences at 2'6" or higher. To be eligible for green hunter status, horses must not have shown over fences 2'6" or higher prior to the current competition year. Fences to be 2'6" and 3". Both heights must be offered and judged together.

A horse is eligible for reinstatement of their 1st Green year if they have not shown at more than three (3) shows over fences at 2'6" or higher prior to August 1st of the competition year upon application to the SWVHJA office. The application will be reviewed by the Board of Directors. Horses are eligible for one (1) reinstatement of Green status.

SWVJA Working Hunter - Open to horses. Judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences offered at 3'3" & 3'6". The second course is designated as the Lt. Hatchell Handy Class - Awarded to the winner of the designated Working Hunter over Fences class which will have a special course with emphasis on brilliance and handiness that you would find in the hunting field. Hunting attire requested, but not required.

SWVHJA Adult Hunter - Open to adult amateur riders mounted on horses or ponies. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences to be 3'.

SWVHJA Childrens Hunter - Open to juniors mounted on horse. To be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Fences to be 3'.

SWVHJA Special Adult and Childrens Hunter - Open to horses or ponies shown by amateurs. Horse and rider combination cannot compete over fences higher than 2'9" at the same show. Fences 2'6" and 2'9".

SWVHJA Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse - Open to horses shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by an Adult. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) It is acceptable for SWVHJA Horse Shows to combine the Adult Hunter Pleasure and the Junior Pleasure Hunter Divisions, however, it is the show secretary's responsibility to indicate on the results which is the Adult rider and which is the Junior rider. If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Division and the Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division. To be judged on manners, suitability, and way of going. For year end points to accrue, three entries must enter and compete in all three classes of the division.

SWVHJA Hunter Pleasure Pony - Open to ponies shown with hunter tack on the flat ridden by a Junior. Classes to be offered may include but are not limited to: Walk/Go As You Please, Walk/Trot, and Walk/Trot/Canter. No over fences classes will count toward this division. (Shows offering a Pleasure Hunter division with over fences classes may offer this division as a separate division.) If entries warrant, the Hunter Pleasure Pony division may be combined with the Junior Hunter Pleasure Horse division and Adult Hunter Pleasure Horse division. A pony can be considered a horse at a show if the pony is not exhibited in a pony restricted division such as pony. Therefore, it is acceptable for an adult to ride a pony in the Adult Pleasure Division as long as the pony is not shown in pony restricted division at the same show.

Leadline - Open to riders six years of age and under. Riders may not cross enter into any other class at the horse show.
Equitation Division
2'-2 1/2" Junior & Amateur Equitation Division - Open to riders and horses/ponies that have not competed over fences 2'11" or higher in any competition.

Equitation Classes
SWVHJA Adult Equitation on the Flat - Open to amateurs 18 years of age and older. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring and judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used, excluding those requiring work over fences. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Junior Equitation on the flat. Riders must stay within their age group if classes are split by age.

SWVHJA Junior Equitation on the Flat - Open to junior riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st. To be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. Judged on position, control, and guidance. USEF tests 1-19 may be used. Three entries are necessary to fill this class. Riders need not be members of SWVHJA to compete. If there are insufficient entries, this class may be combined with the Adult Equitation on the Flat. Will be split by age (15-17 & 14 and Under). Riders must stay within their age group.

SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class - Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the calendar year. To be shown over a course of fences not to exceed 3' that must include two changes of direction, a combination and at least three oxers. A minimum of six riders, if available, must be called back to work on the flat. Maringales may not be used in the flat phase. Each phase to count 50%. Same horse must be used for both phases. Four entries are required to fill the class with a minimum of three to complete the class. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Adult Medal. SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Hunter Seat Medal Finals.

SWVHJA Adult Medal Class - Same specs as for the SWVHJA Hunter Seat Medal Class, except open to amateur riders 18 years of age and older. Ponies may be ridden by adults, but may not be shown in the Pony Hunter division at the same horse show. If there are fewer than four entries, this class can be combined with the Hunter Seat Medal. SWVHJA Adult Medal contestants may compete throughout the year. The top twenty (20) point earners (including ties), with a minimum of 10 points, will be invited to compete in the Adult Medal Finals.

Entries

- ◊ Six ribbons will be awarded in each class
- ◊ Championship and Reserve Championship ribbons will be awarded in each hunter division. Ribbons can be picked up at the announcer's stand.
- ◊ Three entries, unless otherwise stated, are necessary to fill a class.
- ◊ Entry forms must be filled out completely, including all classes or divisions entered, signatures, and organization or membership numbers before numbers may be issued.
- ◊ A negative **Coggins** within 12 month and proof of vaccinations within 6 months of the show is required.
- ◊ A copy of the coggins test and SBC Health Requirement Form must be given to the secretary upon arrival.

◊ **An open check is required before numbers will be issued.**

◊ Pre-entry - must be entered by 3pm the Friday before the show.

◊ Entries received after 3PM the Friday before the show will be charge a \$10 office fee.

◊ No phone entries.
